Course Descriptions

BE 280: Paul and Early Christianity (DMin, MDiv)

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the life and times of the Apostle Paul, an important and complicated character within early church history and a key contributor to Early Christian Scriptures. The student will be introduced to a wide variety of historical methodologies that will help to clarify Paul's interactions with the Jewish and Graeco-Roman worlds. Through consideration of these historical contexts, the student will gain a better understanding of the world in which Paul travelled and taught, which will lead to a better understanding of Paul's words in his epistles.

ESC 202: Anglicanism in Context (MDiv)

The goal of this course is to equip students with a common vocabulary of experiences, concepts, and reflective tools, to make sense of the life of faith communities and their leaders in the contemporary world. Components of this course are drawn from church history (Canadian and global), doctrine, pastoral leadership, ecumenics, and sociology of religion. The course will involve an experiential component, inviting students to share and reflect on their current and prior experiences of church as well as stepping outside that experience to observe and learn from a faith community with which they are unfamiliar.
